Academic Expectations

Pathway Scholars are required to have a **3.4 UK cumulative grade point average** (GPA). Students who earn less than a 3.4 will automatically be placed on probation. If a student maintains less than a 3.4 for two consecutive semesters, he or she will be dismissed from the program. All standards of the University of Kentucky, such as academic honesty and integrity, must also be upheld. Should a student fail to meet any of these standards, this may warrant immediate expulsion from the program.

Co-Curricular Requirements

Community Service:

Leadership involves active citizenship and community engagement. Thus, to foster your leadership development, Pathway Scholars are required to engage in meaningful community service.

Students must complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service each semester.

You will be provided with a variety of opportunities during the academic year to complete your service requirements, but it is ultimately your responsibility to fulfill this obligation. You will also be required to maintain accurate records of your service activities and complete paperwork as instructed. **Examples of approved activities include the following**: attending college recruiting functions, service opportunities through BBNvolved, volunteering at local non-profits, on-campus charitable events.

Professional Development:

Pathway Scholars are required to attend at least FOUR professional development events per semester. Options will be provided for students to choose from over the course of the academic year.

Additional Events:

Pathway Scholars may be required to attend additional events throughout the academic year such as professional conferences, career fairs, academic lectures, and program meetings. If the event is deemed mandatory, notice will be given as far in advance as possible.

Professional Dress & Behavior:

You should exhibit professional behavior within the College and beyond by working to meet your obligations and program expectations in all situations, including participation in other campus organizations, class, internships, education abroad programs, and community service projects. As members of the program, you will experience unique networking opportunities that other students may not have until they are juniors or seniors. It is important to represent yourself well in these types of situations. When required to wear business casual or business professional attire, **here is a guide:**



Faculty Advisory Board

The Faculty Advisory Board consists of four to six faculty members who meet periodically throughout the year to provide support to the Pathway Director and address issues that may arise or to review proposed changes to the Pathway Programs. The Faculty Advisory Board has the ability to determine official Pathway policy in conjunction with the Honors College. The Pathway Director and the Associate Dean of Undergraduate Affairs are ex-officio voting members.
